_____ Petitioner Most Recent Income Taxes - helps to show that you can support your fiancé.
_____ Petitioner Divorce Documents, Annulment or Death Certificate of Previous Spouse
(if either of you have ever been divorced, please obtain court certified documents of the dissolution or annulment. If you are widowed, bring the death certificate.)
_____ Petitioner Court and police documents (applicable if petitioner or fiancé have ever been arrested or detained)
_____ Petitioner List of where you have **lived** for 5 years. Both the petitioner and beneficiary are required to give a list.

_____ Petitioner List of where you have **worked** for 5 years. Both the petitioner and beneficiary are required to give a list.

Fiance/Fiancee:

_____ Fiancé 2 Passport Photos of Fiancé
_____ Fiancé Birth Certificate of Fiancé, must be translated into English
_____ Fiancé Passport of Fiancé - Update Passports for travel. Provide a copy of the photo page. Passport must be valid for at least 9 months.
_____ Fiancé Passport and birth certificate of any **accompanying** unmarried child under 21.
_____ Fiancé List of all children. (Stepchildren under 18 included) even if they are not accompanying the fiancé
_____ Fiancé parents dates of birth: (mom) _____ (dad) _____
_____ Fiancé Divorce Documents, Annulment or Death Certificate of Previous Spouse
(if either of you have ever been divorced, please obtain court certified documents of the dissolution or annulment. If you are widowed, bring the death certificate.)
_____ Fiancé List of where you both have **lived** for 5 years. Both the petitioner and beneficiary are required to give a list.
_____ Fiancé List of where you both have **worked** for 5 years. Both the petitioner and beneficiary are required to give a list.

Intent to Marry & Required meeting

_____ Original Statements of your mutual intent to marry
_____ Photos of you and your fiancé(e) together
_____ Evidence of meeting within the past 2 years
_____ Copy of Airline tickets or passport (travel) stamps, and any photographs of you and your fiancé together.

Establishing the Fiancée relationship

Submit additional evidence to show that you and the beneficiary have a bona fide intent to marry. Evidence of a bona fide intent may be, but is not limited to:

- _____ A statement with details on how you and the beneficiary first met and made the decision to become engaged.
- _____ Evidence of correspondence between you and the beneficiary.
- _____ Plans for the wedding and reception that you and the beneficiary have considered.
- _____ Sworn affidavits from your parents/family members regarding their knowledge of your intent to marry
- _____ Any other evidence that can show that you and the beneficiary have a bona fide intent to marry

Evidence showing continuous communication between you and your fiancé such as:

- _____ Birth certificates of any children born of the relationship.
- _____ telephone bills screenshots of chats, texts, etc.
- _____ letters with their original envelopes and postmarks
- _____ Email between you and your fiancé
- _____ Evidence of financial support, Money Gram or Western Union receipts
- _____ Itinerary of travel, email confirmation
- _____ Passport with Travel Stamps
- _____ Copy of airline tickets for subsequent trips to visit the beneficiary.
- _____ Receipts for pre-wedding expenses if any
- _____ 2 Sworn affidavits from your parents/family members regarding their knowledge of your relationship
- _____ Photos of you and your spouse, or you and your fiancée taken before and during your engagement.
- _____ Or any other evidence that you feel would establish that your fiancé relationship is bona fide.

Other:

- _____ Waiver for multiple applications (applicable only if this is your second or third fiancé)
- _____ Request waiver of meeting requirement due to culture or religion
