Evi	statement with details on how you and the beneficiary first met and made the decision to become engaged. Idence of correspondence between you and the beneficiary.

	orn affidavits from your parents/family members regarding their knowledge of your intent to marry y other evidence that can show that you and the beneficiary have a bona fide intent to marry
